HSIE – The problem with TIME

Students in 7HSIY participated in a practical lesson on time in their latest history lesson. Students were challenged to order dates chronologically. They started with a simple exercise of arranging themselves by birth date. Students were asked to work collaboratively, and problem solve to find a solution to two specific time challenges. The challenges were progressively more difficult, and students were able to make decisions after discussions with their peers. Their knowledge of the terms BC, BCE, AD and CE were solidified, as was the concept of chronological order. Students were then asked to write two Tweets about their experience. The first was to answer the question -What does a timeline enable us to see? Dylan C Tweeted – '*It enables us to see different times in order. It enables us to sort out times in chronological order.*'

Students were also asked to define chronological order. Georgia R Tweeted – 'Oldest to most recent, or most recent to oldest, as long as it's in order.'



Making payments

Payments can be made at the front office between the hours of 8:15am to 1:30pm each day. Students may make payments at the office before school, recess and lunch times only. Payment options are credit card and cash. The preferred payment method is **online**.

Statement of Accounts are sent out every 2 weeks to parents email address. Your Statement of account will contain school fees, excursions and other payments that arise. At times you will receive a Statement of Account for an individual item e.g. an excursion that needs payment by a certain date.

Excursions and incursions have a closing date and NO late payments will be accepted after the given date. Online payments for excursions and incursions have a closing date of 2 days prior to payments being due at the front office.
