## What is the Student Representative Council (SRC)

At Terrigal High School, the SRC is a council of students, elected by their peers from their respective year groups, for a twelve-month term.

## **Roles and Responsibilities for Junior SRC Members**

The key aim of the SRC is to represent student opinions and interests in social and organisational matters at school. The SRC is actively involved in daily school life and decision making, supported by their coordinating teacher.

The students selected are role models for the school and encourage all students at THS to become responsible leaders within our community and nurture the traits of good citizenship. They do this as they communicate between the student body, faculty, and the senior executive of the school.

Additionally, SRC will be involved in organising fundraising, attending meetings, talking to their peers and to assist the facilitation of activities during whole school events. Members will be required to attend regular meetings to discuss events that may be approaching. They will be involved in some important decision-making processes across the school.

A letter and/or phone call will be given to your parents. You might be asked to submit a letter of resignation or asked to step down from the SRC.
