#### Welcome BBQ

#### **School Communications**

A strength of our school is the willingness to share experiences and for open, 2-way communication. The majority of school communications are sent from the school email address. This includes permission notes, school updates and the weekly Terrigal Talk for upcoming events. A limited number of paper copies are kept at the front counter. The school newsletter is sent twice a Term and also uploaded to the school website.

The Terrigal High School Facebook page is an opportunity to share our news, celebrate student successes and to communicate last minute changes.

The parent portal provides access to your own child's timetable, attendance record and school reports. Year 7 parents will receive their username and password next week.

The school uses SMS communications for urgent information as well to notify parents of lateness to school or whole day absences. Parents can reply to the message to inform the school of the reason for the lateness or absence.

Contact with individual teachers is through a phone call or email to the school address. Teachers spend nearly all day in the classroom teaching and cannot accept calls immediately. The expectation is that teachers will respond to phone calls and emails within 48 hours of receipt. Urgent communications are directed to the Deputy Principals. If your communication involves more than 1 teacher, the best person to contact is the Year Adviser.

## New Year - New on Time You!

Regular attendance and punctuality play a significant role in allowing students to succeed at school. Here at Terrigal High School we are looking to improve our student attendance rates for 2021 with a particular focus on punctuality.

Whilst five minutes may seem insignificant in the scheme of things, time can add up quickly. If you are late five minutes each day, that is the equivalent of three days over the course of the school year. Similarly if you miss one day of school a fortnight, before you realise that adds up to four weeks over the course of the year. Now we are talking significant chunks of class time missed.

To help our consistently late students develop good routines, we are instigating Late Cards. If students are late three times in one week they will be issued with a consequence and a Late Card for two weeks. Any lateness for any reason whilst completing this process will result in further consequences. Students will be required to undertake two weeks of being on time to successfully complete the process.

We also ask for your support in explaining any absences that your child has. This can be done by replying to the text message sent by THS on the day of the absence. Please be sure to include your child's full name and year on the message.

# PSST (Personalised Senior Student Tutoring) News and Information

#### YEAR 11 Students...You're Invited

Mrs Morris will be holding a focus tutorial for any students wishing to optimise their organisation for assessment time management by learning the **Personal Due Date Strategy.** 

Never heard of this?

If you do not know about the strategy, this session is for you!

Learning this strategy will ensure students plan/schedule their calendar per subject, per assessment task.

It is aligned directly with the assessment schedule and aims at making the most of the time given before the due date of any assessment task for any subject.

#### Personal Due Date Strategy Tutorial Details

<u>Date</u>: Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> March (Week 6)

Time: From the end of Lunch- 12:40pm - 1:35pm On the day, there is

flexibility to extend this until 2:00pm if students require.

<u>Location</u>: THS Library

To book: There is a purple booking sheet on the appointment table at Mrs

Morris's door. There are 40 places available for this session.

<u>What to bring</u>: Students are asked to bring the following:

- 1. Their own copy of the assessment schedule
- 2. Highlighters- one colour per subject- to be used for colour coding each subject on their schedule and calendar.
- 3. A pen and a lead pencil
- 4. Assessment notifications for any subject, given by the class teacher. You will need to refer to the exact due dates given on the notification document. (Do not worry if you do not have any notifications yet).

<u>What will students be given</u>: Students will be given all other resources, including the information guide for the strategy and calendars for the scheduling task. Calendars will be completed by each student during the session. The tutorial gives students the opportunity to learn, apply and ask questions about the strategy.

## YEAR 12 Students...Upcoming REACH Program

In the coming weeks all students in Year 12 will be invited to participate in the Reach Program. This voluntary program is designed to help Year 12 students achieve their personal best in their HSC and allows them to work towards improving their exam preparation and ultimately their exam performance.

In short, students nominate a teacher mentor and a focus subject in which to complete 20 extra tasks in addition to their classwork and assessment tasks. This additional exam based work provides a specific and targeted focus, supporting students in achieving their HSC goals.

As a year group, students will be briefed by Mrs Bennett in a meeting at school and Mrs Morris will coordinate the program, distribute information and communicate with students as required. Details are currently being discussed...we'll keep you up to date as information is confirmed...stay tuned!


