Year 12 news

Congratulations to our Year 12 Society and Culture students who submitted their personal interest projects (PIPs) to NESA for marking on Monday. This year's group explored a range of topics including perceptions of beauty, gender politics in the mainstream media, roadblocks to careers in the arts, toxic masculinity and mental health in society. I have read some of the PIPs and have been impressed with the depth of understanding of the topics, the appropriate choices to reference primary and secondary sources and the quality of the academic writing.

This year's Year 12 students have shown resilience and understanding beyond their years as they grapple with the constant announcements and changes required as we fight this virus together. As a school our decision making is focused on how best we can meet the needs of our students.

Based on the government's announcement we will only be hosting a handful of students for short periods of time to collect equipment or access specialist facilities in order to complete major works. After extensive research of options, the executive have decided to cancel the Trial HSC examinations scheduled for weeks 7 and 8 and instead run "mock trials" for students to practice under exam conditions.

Year 11 are currently finishing the last few topics for each syllabus. At this stage there have been no decisions as to the final assessments for the Preliminary courses as we await further advice from the government. Students in Years 7 to 10 have been engaging well with Teams meetings and Google classroom activities. The meetings are an opportunity for teachers to provide feedback on the previous day's tasks and introduce the new work. The students are also challenged with a range of non-screen base activities including the PDHPE 1000 point challenge and craft activities.






THS Wellbeing Hub






With our favourite cafes and restaurants closed there is certainly a lot more cooking going on at home. Staff and students share their culinary skills!
