Principals Report

Term 2 has seen a continued, dynamic, and busy time across our school community. The reporting cycle for this semester is now complete with the parent teacher evenings earlier this term, and more recently parents and caregivers receiving their child's formal semester 1 reports.

Thank you to everyone who engaged with the Subject Selection process with your child to ensure their chosen subjects are best suited to their strengths and interests in 2024. Our Year 10 students, parents and caregivers in particular had a more rigorous process this semester with online/face to face interviews enabling a more accurate HSC pattern of study in Year 11. Congratulations to all involved in this reworked process.

Year 6 into 7 transition has begun with our wellbeing team communicating regularly with our partner primary schools THS and EHPS. The Year 7 2024 Information evening was held in week 9, and it was fantastic to meet so many incoming students and families who attended this evening to assist their child transition to the high school setting.

We continue to set and enforce expectations for all of our students here at Terrigal High School. Expectations in the classroom, playground and interactions with peers and staff are all highly important to allow everyone to learn and feel connected to our school community.

Year 11 and 12 students and parents/caregivers have been emailed updated information around Flexible Attendance and the relaunching of the Senior Study Hub. Senior students are to use the kiosks located at administration and the amphitheatre to sign in and out whilst on flexible attendance. Our Careers Department have relocated to the library, so they are more accessible to our students for more effective communication with our seniors.

Communication has been sent to parents and caregivers and students around our end of term events. These being our CAPA concert (Tuesday 27th June), We Strive Awards BBQ (Wednesday 28th June) and We Strive Student Assembly (Thursday 29th June, Period 2) and the SRC End of Term 2 whole school event (Thursday 29th June, Periods 3 and 4). These activities, along with the many extracurricular opportunities offered to our students provide quality experiences for all. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our SRC, Wellbeing Team and THS staff for their hard work organising these events for our students.

Year 8

After a semester of looking into Engineered Systems, Year 8s are now getting the chance to fill their Lolly Dispensers and test whether their gearing allows the release of lollies. Some students made additions of other simple machines, such as inclined slopes to increase the efficiency of their dispensers.








In preparation for the design of their bottle rockets, Year 8 STEM Passion Projects constructed some paper models to test for the Centre of Mass and the Centre of Pressure. Students wanted to see how these two 'centres' effected each other and whether a rocket would work better after changing their relative positions.



Year 9

Year 9 Engineering conducted the final test runs of their tallest, most stable towers. The students created drawings using Adobe Illustrator of interlocking repeatable units. Their drawings were then used to cut out their designs on the laser cutter. Using a limited amount of material, they needed to create the tallest tower that wouldn't fall over when being influenced by a simulated earthquake.

Year 11 Exploring Early Childhood had their Playgroup Assessment Task, an event looked forward to by participants young and old. Students invite young guests with custom designed and crafted invitations, plan the afternoon's activities, interact with the children and make teaching and learning observations.



Year 11 Food Technology students have been learning about the scientific changes that food undergoes during cooking. During Week 9, students completed an Assessment task whereby they had to plan, prepare, and present a dish that demonstrated the changes that occurred to them during cooking.
